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





OUR FOUNDER

We would not be here if it were not for Cal Johnston. Growing up in an orphanage, Cal learned the importance of providing a safe place for youth. He credits the support he received during his youth as what enabled him to succeed as a graduate of the University of Southern California, As a First Lieutenant in the Air Force, and as a real estate development investor.

In 1998, Cal was introduced to the Boys & Girls Clubs of America, serving as a Regional Trustee between 1998 and 2017. Cal traveled across the country, visiting different Clubs and observing how Clubs



were delivering programming to youth and families. During that time, Cal observed that many Clubs were isolated from schools, making it difficult for children to attend.

In 2001, Cal founded Boys & Girls Clubs of Greater Conejo Valley (BGCGCV) and built Clubhouse facilities on middle school campuses to ensure access for all youth in our communities. At the time, Cal envisioned starting six Clubs in the Conejo area. Today, BGCGCV runs nine Clubs, serving thousands of members every year, across Los Angeles and Ventura counties.

LEAP INITIATIVE TAKES FLIGHT

Taking action against the learning crisis through innovative solutions and strategies to create a brighter future

Recent studies reveal that mathematics and reading scores have declined across the nation in 4th and 8th graders. This troubling trend has been linked to the disruption of schools due to the pandemic, as many students have lost out on vital learning opportunities during this time, along with being unable to engage with peers, participate in extracurricular activities, or receive emotional support from teachers and counselors. The effects of this decline are far-reaching, with implications for college readiness, employment prospects, and future economic performance.

To address this learning crisis, Boys & Girls Clubs of Greater Conejo Valley has launched LEAP (Learning Enhancement Acceleration Program), a research-based initiative designed to help our youth recover lost or stalled educational progress. By utilizing evidence-based methods, we can help close learning gaps and provide students with a more successful academic experience.

Our facilities provide safe locations, and our staff are well-trained to ensure students have access to the engaging learning opportunities necessary for success. We look forward to contributing towards a brighter future for our students through this program.



At the Boys & Girls Clubs of Greater Conejo Valley (BGCGCV), we have been serving the youth who need us most for 22 years. By providing programs that focus on academic success, good character and citizenship, and healthy lifestyles, our Clubs have helped generations of young people achieve the great futures they deserve.



2022 was a challenging year for investments, not only for individuals but also for organizations like BGCGCV. Despite recording investment income in previous years, we encountered a loss this year, which we have subtracted from our reported total income.

The economic impact of our programs is far-reaching.

When parents and guardians have a safe place for their children and teens to spend time before and after school and during school breaks, they can maintain work schedules, limit their childcare costs, ensure their kids are in a positive environment, and provide academic and emotional support for their children. The positive impacts of membership in the Boys & Girls Clubs include reduced alcohol use, less involvement in gangs, less involvement with the law, and reducing other high-risk activities.

Our members go on to be healthy and productive adults who contribute to our communities and economies and give back to our Clubs. Our staff and volunteers gain invaluable experience and continue to give back year after year.
