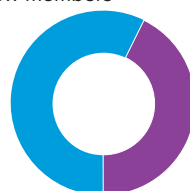

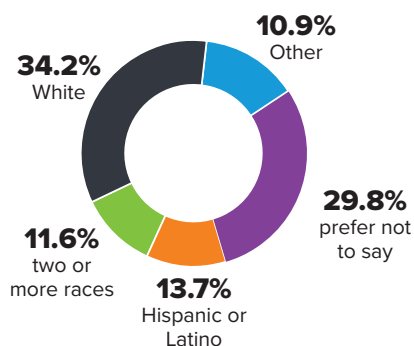

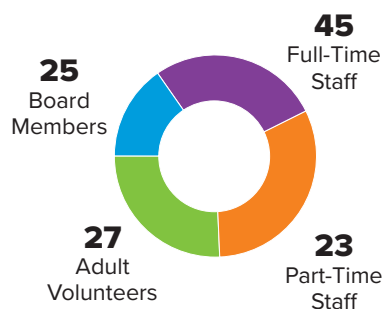

# OUR FOUNDER

We would not be here if it were not for Cal Johnston. Growing up in an orphanage, Cal learned the importance of providing a safe place for youth. He credits the support he received during his youth as what enabled him to succeed as a graduate of the University of Southern California, As a First Lieutenant in the Air Force, and as a real estate development investor.

In 1998, Cal was introduced to the Boys & Girls Clubs of America, serving as a Regional Trustee between 1998 and 2017. Cal traveled across the country, visiting different Clubs and observing how Clubs were delivering programming to youth and families. During that time, Cal observed that many Clubs were isolated from schools, making it difficult for children to attend.

In 2001, Cal founded Boys & Girls Clubs of Greater Conejo Valley (BGCGCV) and built Clubhouse facilities on middle school campuses to ensure access for all youth in our communities. At the time, Cal envisioned starting six Clubs in the Conejo area. Today, BGCGCV runs nine Clubs, serving thousands of members every year, across Los Angeles and Ventura counties.

We returned to the Four Seasons Hotel in Westlake Village where Anderson Auto served as our exclusive auto sponsor. Dinner was hosted by Seth & Jolyn Haye and Jeff & Karen Johnston.

At the heart of the gala our honoree, Los Angeles Rams alum and *Walter Payton Man of the Year* awardee, Andrew Whitworth, spoke about the importance of community support in ensuring that every child has access to the resources they need to succeed. Our youth speakers, Amara Garcia and Aaron Chapman, also shared their personal stories about how the Clubs have helped them grow and thrive.

He moved in with his aunt and uncle in California where he and his brother joined the Rocky & Lon Morton Boys & Girls Club. While dealing with trauma, slipping grades, and the loneliness of living in a new place, the staff at the Club accepted him and quickly learned about his affinity for music. They helped him use music to process his emotions, and now he is a professional guitarist and credits the Club with saving his life and helping him discover his passion.

# LEAP INITIATIVE TAKES FLIGHT



## Taking action against the learning crisis through innovative solutions and strategies to create a brighter future

Recent studies reveal that mathematics and reading scores have declined across the nation in 4th and 8th graders. This troubling trend has been linked to the disruption of schools due to the pandemic, as many students have lost out on vital learning opportunities during this time, along with being unable to engage with peers, participate in extracurricular activities, or receive emotional support from teachers and counselors. The effects of this decline are far-reaching, with implications for college readiness, employment prospects, and future economic performance.

To address this learning crisis, Boys & Girls Clubs of Greater Conejo Valley has launched LEAP (Learning Enhancement Acceleration Program), a research-based initiative designed to help our youth recover lost or stalled educational progress. By utilizing evidence-based methods, we can help close learning gaps and provide students with a more successful academic experience.

Our facilities provide safe locations, and our staff are well-trained to ensure students have access to the engaging learning opportunities necessary for success. We look forward to contributing towards a brighter future for our students through this program.

## Research-Based Programming

### Power Hour

Tutors, mentors, and staff help students with daily homework and high-yield learning activities that enhance critical thinking skills, improve retention, and increase engagement.



### SMART Girls & Passport to Manhood

We prioritize the development of healthy lifestyles, which includes fostering physical and mental wellness, as well as building positive relationships through personal decision-making.



### STEM—Science, Technology, Engineering, & Math

STEM activities engage youth in real-world problems, allowing them to explore solutions in a project-based, hands-on, and active manner in the Club's casual learning environment.

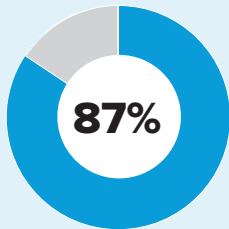

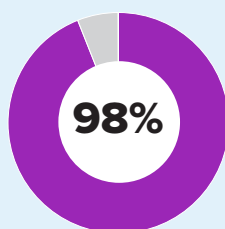
# INCREDIBLE YOUTH OUTCOMES

The National Youth Outcomes Initiative (NYOI) was launched in 2011. This initiative was built to measure the impact of Clubs using a common set of research-informed indicators. NYOI is a tremendous asset to demonstrate impact, support advocacy and resource development, and, most importantly, gain insights to improve performance and make a bigger impact on our Club members. NYOI's primary tool for gathering outcomes data is a survey administered to Club members each spring.

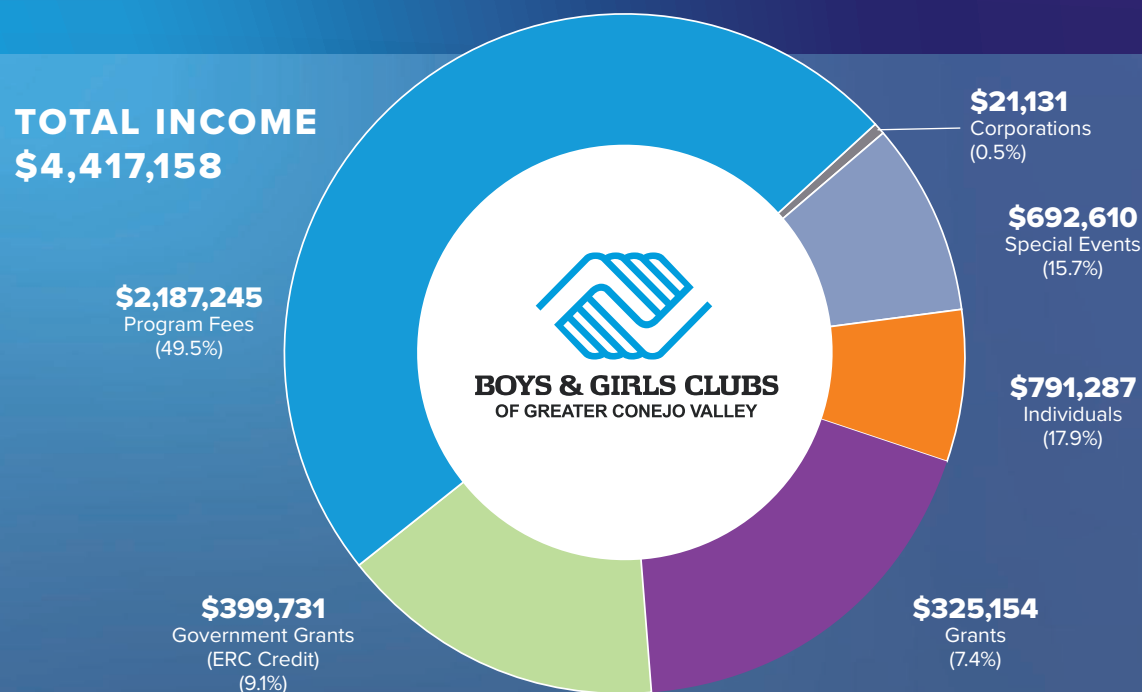
