Classes are offered at NO ADDITIONAL CHARGE when monthly members are enrolled in the after-school program. Non-monthly members are welcome to enroll in these programs on a pay as you go basis.

ANTI-BULLYING— Empowering youths to identify and address bullying behaviors, teaching prevention techniques, and providing guidance on reporting incidents.

FAMILY ENGAGEMENT ACTIVITIES— Engaging youths in activities that foster positive family relationships, promote positive outcomes, and discourage risky behaviors.

JUNIOR YOUTH OF THE YEAR— Cultivating leadership potential among young individuals, laying the groundwork for academic success, and recognizing their achievements in leadership.

KEYSTONE— Encouraging youths to connect and socialize with peers, explore relevant issues, and develop skills to support both their Club and community.

Education & Career Development

Through hands-on experiments, interactive projects, and exploration of cutting-edge concepts, youths gain the capacity to adapt, innovate, and excel in fields that drive progress.

STEM— Connecting youths with hands-on, activity-based STEM curriculum covering various topics such as energy and electricity, engineering design, food chemistry, and sports science.

DIPLOMAS2DEGREES (d2D)— Guiding youths towards high school graduation, college readiness, and career success.

DIY STEM— Engaging youths in exploring science, technology, engineering, and math concepts through interactive hands-on activities.

CAREER LAUNCH— Equipping youths with techniques and practices for effective studying, completing homework, and preparing for future careers.

IN-CLUB WORK-BASED LEARNING— Providing opportunities for youths to explore different careers, gain employability skills, and acquire real-life work experiences.

OUT-OF-CLUB WORK-BASED LEARNING— Offering leadership experiences and opportunities for youths to apply their developed skills through internships, apprenticeships, or part-time paid jobs.

Nurturing well-being and fostering personal growth helps youths to develop a strong sense of self and the skills to thrive independently.



GRIEF AND BEREAVEMENT— Encouraging youths to express their thoughts and feelings in a healthy and supportive way through play, creative activities, and physical movement while learning about grief.

IMAGEMAKERS NATIONAL PHOTOGRAPHY CONTEST—

Sparking youths' interest in photography and teaching them the art and science behind it through exciting categories like culture, portraits, nature, fashion, and editing.

INDIVIDUAL RECREATION ACTIVITIES— Providing a safe environment for youths to explore their uniqueness through activities such as walking, meditation, reading, games, and dancing.

LOCALLY DEVELOPED PROGRAMS FOSTERING HEALTHY LIFESTYLES

LYRICISM 101— Empowering youths to develop music, performance, and literacy skills while discovering the power of communication, collaboration, and passion for creativity.

MONEY MATTERS—Engaging youths in financial decisionmaking through interactive tools and games that make saving money and budgeting thought-provoking and enjoyable.

NATIONAL ARTS— Inspiring creativity and skill development in visual, digital, and performing arts, and recognizing youths for their accomplishments.

DAILY CHALLENGES— Building knowledge of healthy habits, good nutrition, and physical fitness through progressive and interactive activities while interacting positively with peers through agility, coordination, and speed challenges.

HEALTHY HABITS— Empowering youths with practical activities that develop skills, confidence, and motivation to make healthy nutritional choices throughout their lives.

SOCIAL RECREATION— Fostering healthy relationships with oneself and others through activities that enhance understanding of emotions and promote responsible decision-making.
